


Who's in Control?

Lesson Scripture: 2 Chronicles 20:13-15, 17-18

God's Word

13 All the men of Judah, with their wives and children and little ones, stood there before the LORD. 14 Then the Spirit of the LORD came on Jahaziel son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite and descendant of Asaph, as he stood in the assembly. 15 He said: "Listen, King Jehoshaphat and all who live in Judah and Jerusalem! This is what the LORD says to you: 'Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's."

17 "'You will not have to fight this battle. Take up your positions; stand firm and see the deliverance the LORD will give you, Judah and Jerusalem. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged. Go out to face them tomorrow, and the LORD will be with you.'" 18 Jehoshaphat bowed down with his face to the ground, and all the people of Judah and Jerusalem fell down in worship before the LORD.



Bible Story

Who's in Control?

2 Chronicles 20:13-15, 17-18

Jehoshaphat was the fourth king of the kingdom of Judah. As king, he removed the idols and followed God's commands. When the large army of the Moabites, Ammonites, and Meunites came to fight against Jehoshaphat and his army, Jehoshaphat prayed to God.

In today's Scripture text, all the people of Judah stood with Jehoshaphat before God to pray for help. The Spirit of God spoke through Jahaziel, a Levite and a descendant of Asaph's. Jahaziel told the king and people not to fear the enemy's large army. He encouraged the people because the battle was not the people's battle—it belonged to God. God gave them instructions on what to do and where they would find their enemies in the Desert of Jeruel.

God's Spirit continued to tell Jahaziel that Jehoshaphat and the people of Judah would only need to stand firm. They did not need to fight because God would save them. As God's Spirit continued to speak, Jahaziel told them that they would go out tomorrow but would not be alone. God would be with them. They did not need to fear or worry because God was in control. Then King Jehoshaphat and all the people of Judah and Jerusalem bowed and worshipped before God.
